TADPOLES 3 – 5 YEARS | 9 AM – 4 PM • Full Day \$150 / week • Half-Day \$80 / week

Tadpole camp weeks will concentrate on introducing children to the outside world. Your child will enjoy weeks full of games, crafts and outdoor discoveries. A PEEC instructor plans the activities and oversees a maximum of 12 children with the help of camp counselors and volunteers.

JUNE 25 – 29

BUGS & BLOOMS

There's a remarkable world around us! Search the forests and fields to learn about the world of plants and insects. Campers will study flowers up close, plant seeds in a garden, and use bug nets to capture insects.

JULY 2 – 6

FANTASTIC FROGS

Tadpoles will find, catch, and learn all about the frogs and amphibians that live around PEEC. We'll explore the ponds, and streams, and search all through the woods for these amazing creatures.

JULY 9 – 13

ECO-EXPLORERS

We'll flip over logs, look into dirt, and turn over rocks in search of animals and the signs they leave behind. The children will be nature investigators that learn how all things in nature are connected.

JULY 16 – 20

WATER ADVENTURES

During this week, we'll find out what lives in and around the ponds and streams. We will introduce the children to the water in the area by using nets and buckets to search these amazing environments.

JULY 23 – 27

AMAZING ANIMALS

We'll explore, identify, and learn about all the creatures of the Poconos, from the birds to the bears. Campers will discover the differences that make all animals unique and why they are incredible!



WET & SLIMY 1ST - 4TH GRADERS | 9 AM – 4 PM • Full Day \$150 / Week

Wet and Slimy campers will experience weeks full of fun craft projects, games, hikes, and nature discovery sessions. Campers will be encouraged to explore the natural world around them while being closely supervised by our experienced camp staff. Every week will also include a trip to Camp Akenac for swimming.

JUNE 25 – 29

CREEPY CRAWLIES

Some jump, some crawl, and we love them all! Learn all about those spiders, worms, and other critters that may not be so creepy after all.

JULY 2 – 6

ART IN NATURE

Join us this week and discover that nature is full of art! Campers will be encouraged to use their imaginations to explore the natural world. The week will focus on creating masterpieces from nature.

JULY 9 – 13

MAGNIFICENT MAMMALS

Coyotes, skunks, bears, and beavers. Have fun while learning about the mammals that live in the Poconos. Search high and low for any animal signs left behind and explore some amazing artifacts.

An expedition to introduce the Wet n' Slimys to the joy of looking in ponds, under rocks, up trees, and through the streams to find as many frogs, salamanders, and reptiles as we can.

JULY 23 – 27

WINGED WONDERS

It's a bird, it's a plane... no-it's a butterfly! Learn about bats, birds, butterflies, and all of the other amazing things that fly. This week, we will search the PEEC grounds for winged creatures of all shapes and sizes.

JULY 30 – AUG 3

FOSSIL FROLIC

We'll get to play with and learn about rocks, dirt, and many of the fascinating things related to them! During this week, we'll be taking a trip to the local quarry and the campers will be able to take home their very own fossil!

AUGUST 6 – 10

HABITAT EXPLORATION

Habitat is where the home is. Join us as we explore the habitats of the smallest insects to the largest mammals. The week will be filled with fun projects that help attract animals, even in your own backyard.

AUGUST 13 – 17

WATER WORLD

We'll venture far and wide into the world of ponds, streams, and other wetlands. Enjoy fun water activities, including canoeing and muckraking!

Junior Naturalist campers will participate in creative activities that nurture their natural curiosity of the environment, including interpretive hikes, educational games, fun projects and much more! This wet, fun-filled week will be spent exploring our local streams, waterfalls, and riparian zones while learning the importance of a healthy watershed. This week will also include a river trip!

JULY 23 – 27

ROMPING ROCKS

This fun filled week will be spent exploring the rocks, dirt and everything else that's below our feet. This will include a trip to the local quarry where the campers will be and to find and take home their very own fossil! Be prepared to get dirty!

JULY 30 – AUG 3

FISHING FRENZY

Learn knot tying, fish identification, and techniques that will let you catch the big one! This week will include trips to many fishing spots around the Delaware Water Gap and conclude by cooking the fish caught by the campers!

Take a closer look at nature this summer. Campers will be searching for animal prints and learning ways to find and explore local wildlife by using all of their five senses.
